Using eBay for Genealogy



Why Use eBay and for What?

Contrary to what you may believe, there is all sorts of Family History "stuff" on eBay – photos, family bibles, books, etc. It's either feast or famine, but it is always fun! People sell all sorts of things, so checking once a week is a good idea.

Accessing and Searching eBay

- Go to http://www.ebay.com
- Enter your search criteria in the **Search** box. Examples might be just the last name if the last name is unusual, the last name and another descriptive search term such as "Franks Bible".
- Press <enter>.
- Sometimes the results are enormous. For instance, if you search on Hicks, you will find all sorts of things. Go back to the search box and use "negative" limiters. For instance, there were a great number of items with a common term or terms that I wanted to eliminate, so I changed my search to "hicks -disney -attraction -tickets -chick" and pressed <enter>. I have even typed just "family bible" and looked for anything with a name of a family attached. If you use "photo", repeat the search with other words such as "photograph", "tintype", "daguerreotype, " etc. You never know what will work. That is why I always start with the last name only.

the one below.



Getting the Item

You do need to become a registered buyer in order to buy through eBay or to bid on an object. Just follow their simple instructions to sign up. "Buy It Now" means that the price is a fixed price (watch the shipping costs because, sometimes, they are extremely high compared to the price of the item). If you are bidding, bid your highest price. Depending upon how many people are bidding and how much they also want the item, the prices can go way up. Your bid will be at the lowest current possible price to make you the high bidder. Remember that the current bidder may have entered a bid higher than what is showing. It will not let you go over your set amount, so you may be outbid. Some people wait til the last minute on highly wanted items and bid high at the last minute or seconds to have a better chance of getting the item.... so, just be aware. I doubt that this will be the case with most family history type items, but you never know.
